Note: Indefinite adjective are classified as "quantifiers" (a type of determiner) in contemporary grammar. Indefinite adjectives are often used to describe a noun to show an element of ...

Interrogative Pronoun and Interrogative Adjective are two such classifications. The main difference between Interrogative Pronoun and Interrogative Adjective lies in their grammatical functions. As implied by their names, interrogative pronoun is a pronoun and, therefore, replaces a noun while interrogative adjective is an adjective that modifies the noun.

Difference Between Interrogative Pronoun and Interrogative ...

An interrogative pronoun is always an adjective and includes the words: whose, what and which. The pronoun is a word that can ask a question. Examples of interrogative pronouns are: whose keys? what weekend? which street? An indefinite pronoun is always an adjective and includes words such as: each, some, few, many, another, both, all, etc. This pronoun does not define a specific number but, rather, it points to a general amount.
