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Khatzumoto, Glossika, Scott Young's recent experiment.. etc. all of them push the mass beginner sentence craze. I suspect the real reason is that the scripts in some of these languages can sometimes be impenetrable (although not the case for Korean), and that useful natural content with script/text is often very hard to find.

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Currently I am learning around 10-20 new sentences each day, plus reviewing 150-200 sentences I've already learned (served up by the

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algorithm). And to be clear, I wasn't a complete beginner when I started with Glossika. I'm not in Thailand, so using Glossika is how I learn and practise the language each day.
